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CREATING HOPE IN THE BRAZOS VALLEY

In April, Catholic Charities resumed our Creating Hope Brazos Valley Luncheon in Bryan/College Station after pausing the event during the pandemic. We were grateful for the chance to reconnect with our friends in the Brazos Valley and provide an opportunity for them to come together to help families in need in this important community.

Our luncheon's theme was "Do Something." During our program, we emphasized the importance of everyone doing what they can to make our community a better place. Because if we each "do something"—no matter how great or small—collectively we will make a big difference.

Our supporters responded strongly and together, we met our \$100,000 fundraising goal! Our generous guests, including 32 new donors and five new Friends Society members, made vital contributions to support our work to provide mental healthcare, pregnancy and parenting resources, support for veterans, and more in the Brazos Valley.

Anna Byrd, a Counseling Services client, shared her story and described how Catholic Charities' mental health services helped break through her trauma to become a better version of herself. Guests also heard from Very Rev. James Misko (Vicar General for the Diocese of Austin), Deacon Frank Ashley (Deacon, St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church; Senior Associate Dean, Bush School, Texas A&M University), and John Paci (Director of our Brazos Valley office).

PROVIDING TORNADO RELIEF ACROSS CENTRAL TEXAS

When several tornadoes hit the Central Texas area in March, our Disaster Response program immediately sprung to action. Led by Brooke Swate, Director of Disaster Response, Catholic Charities offered financial assistance, emergency housing, free counseling, and free basic needs items to anyone impacted by the tornadoes.

Since then, our Disaster Response program has helped more than 100 families impacted by the tornadoes. We responded to many calls through our Disaster Hotline and participated in Multi-Agency Resource Center (MARC) events to serve families in Round Rock, Elgin, Taylor, and Madisonville.

Special thanks to those who donated toward our tornado relief efforts. Your gifts allowed us to help families, some of whom lost everything, meet their basic needs and begin the road to recovery.

SERVING WACO FAMILIES AT CATHOLIC CHARITIES GIVING DAY

Catholic Charities recently hosted our first drive-thru material giveaway event in Waco. "Catholic Charities Giving Day" in Waco took place on May 6 outside St. Mary Catholic Church. In two hours, we served 51 Waco families with diapers, wipes, cleaning supplies, books for children and more.

This event was sponsored by the St. Gabriel's Pregnancy and Parenting Program (SGPPP) to encourage Waco residents to sign up for support.

"We know many families are facing financial strain right now. We want our Waco community to know we are here for them if they are in need," said Angelica Reyes, Director of SGPPP.

Catholic Charities is planning several other Giving Day events across Central Texas in the months to come.

Time and again, we hear that our Giving Day events are a lifeline for families who are struggling. As you hand them a pack of diapers, you can see a little weight lift off their shoulders. It's a blessing to be a source of hope to them.

ENGAGING STUDENTS AT FIRST-EVER CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING FAIR

On April 22, the Catholic Charities Parish Relations team hosted our first-ever Catholic Social Teaching (CST) Fair at St. Joseph Catholic Academy in Killeen. This event featured hands-on activities designed to teach students about the seven themes of CST.

More than 230 students participated in the fair. Students in Kindergarten through 5th grade received a CST Fair passport, and had it stamped as they traveled to different CST stations. Each station featured activities focused on one of the seven CST Themes, helping students understand each tenet of CST and how to apply them in their daily lives. Middle school students served as student leaders and facilitated activities and stations for the younger students.

Students also had the option to participate in a take-home activity centered around the CST Theme of "Care for God's Creation." 35 students chose to fill up recyclable bags to clean up their community.

The Parish Relations team hopes to replicate the CST Fair at other Catholic schools across the Diocese of Austin to provide more hands-on learning experiences centered on our Catholic faith.
